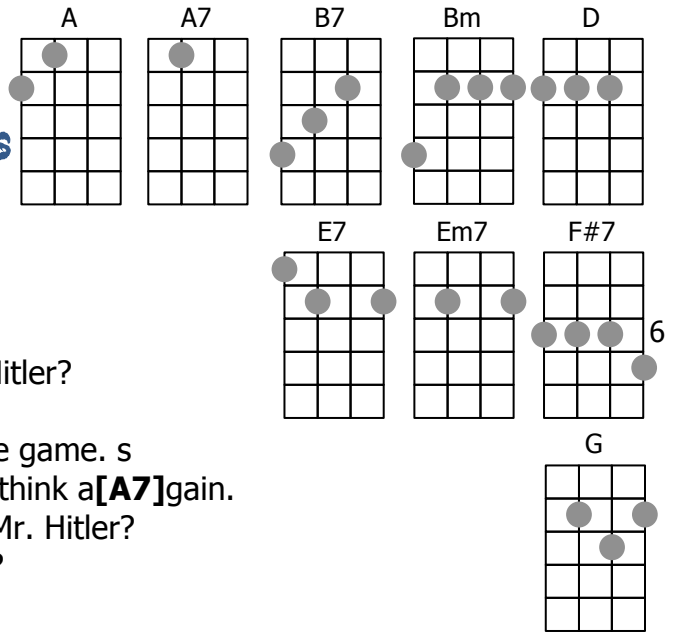


22. Dad's Army, We'll Meet Again and Pack up Your Troubles
